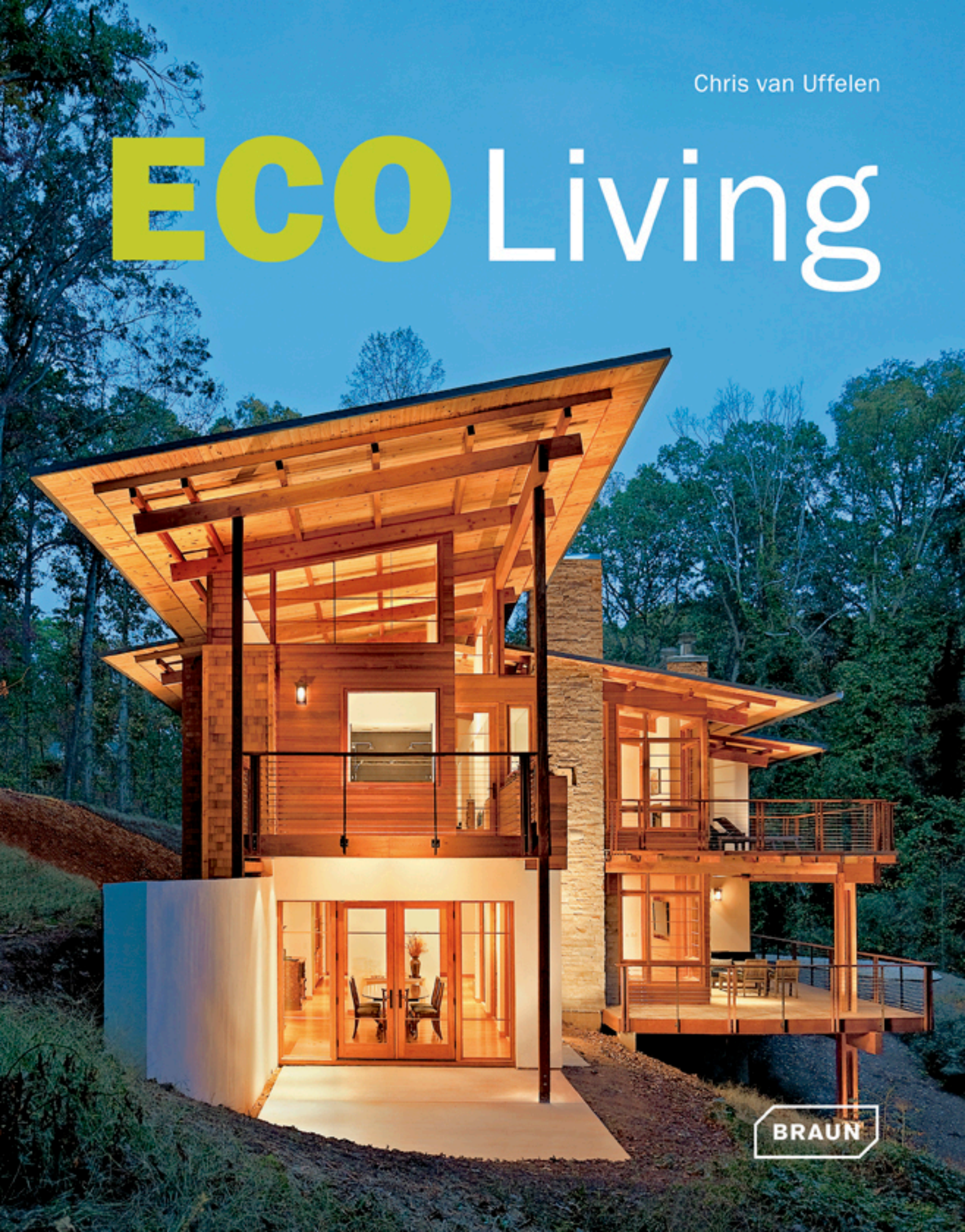

Cap-à-l'Aigle

As part of a unique residential hillside development, this house is completely covered by a green roof, which helps to integrate it into the landscape, insulates it in winter and reduces heat build-up in summer. The building design plays with clear geometrical volumes and is oriented around sunlight, providing optimal natural lighting and energy efficiency. Different types of wood have been used for floor and ceiling to create dramatic perspectives and connections between the volumes.
